To continue refresh that Benajamin Bolling was indeed listed in 1754 Granville under the 3 Saponi Indians Pre Melungeons Chief John Bowling William and James Bolling this demonstrates who or what line Benjamin Bolling came from. We know that Benjamin Bolling left his tribal family to go to the French Indian War where his tribal family family of pre Melungeons migrated through the Flatt River NC. Then to Pittsylvania Co va. We note one of the closet names or 2 are Micjah or Mccager Bunch Moses Riddle other the Blevins Elisha Walling.

By 1774 Lord Dunmores war was on. A chance to crush the larger fiercer tribes Shawnees . This meant more wealth to Va men from all parts of Va. Pay Land Grants Fame Fortune. The Saponi pre Melungeons Baptists and Christians by this time were well mixed blooded people fought for Lord Dunmore. As we can see Benjamin Bolling whole Saponi Pre Melungeon tribe moved with the same people the Riddles Collins Gibsons Bunchs from NC to Pittsylvania Va then Botetourt Fincastle for Lord Dunmores War then by 1783 The family split into new migration paths one side went to the lower side of old Fincastle Washington Co while the others stayed at the upper side in Montgomery Co while by 1787 Jesse Bowling moved with the Melungeons to Ashe Co Christopher Bowling moved with another branch of Melungeons to Hawkins Tenn . John Bowling moved through Madison Clay Co Hawkins. John Rr to Madison Ky to Floyd Ky this was a great bowling melungeon dispersal point. yet they all continue to cross paths with each other.

 NOTE: Bible, p. 31: "From Henryville, Indiana, Mr. Homer Ledford writes of his and his wife's Melungeon ancestors, Bowlings, some of whom where born in the 1750's in what is now Wilkes County, North Carolina, emigrated to Wise County, Virginia, and later to Clay County, Kentucky. He notes that records show that while living in Clay County several received pensions for service in the Revolutionary War.

Jesse Bolling, b. 1 June 1758, Hillsborough, Orange Co., NC--d. 15 August 1841, Perry Co., KY, was a son of the above Benjamin Bolling.

NOTE: Jessee Bolling and Micajah Pennington were both names that appeared on 1787 tax list "A", Montgomery Co., VA (Schreiner-Yantis 1:428, 422).
 Schreiner-Yantis' Montgomery County, Virginia - Circa 1790, p. 78, indicates that Jesse Bowling had removed to NC before the tax could be collected.

1790 census, Wilkes Co., NC, p. 123 col. 1, Tenth Company: Micajah Piniton, Ben Pinniton, Elijah Piniton; Jesse Bolin, 1 fwm over 21; 3 fwm under 21; 3 fwf.

moved c. 1795 to Hawkins Co., TN.

Hawkins Co., TN: Jesse Bolling, William Bolling, Levi Bolling. "Some of the Bollings stayed there and intermarried with the mysterious Melungeon tribe."
 1803, William, Isham, and John Bolling were in Clay County (then part of Madison County), per Lake.

NOTE BY VED: No Jesse Bolling in the Hawkins Co. deeds in the 1790's: only a Christopher Bowling and a T.C. Bowling.

Jesse moved back to Lee County, Virginia and in 1805 bought land there; soon after moved to Knox Co., KY; then Clay Co., KY; then Perry Co., KY.

the fact is Benjamin Bolling has 2 records under the Saponi Indian tribe Bowlings once in 1753 and once in 1754.

These were the Saponi tribe that lived at Gov Spotswood reservation at Ft Christiana. Chief John Bowling left Virginia in 1747 with his band of Mixed blooded warriors

and joined the White settlers in Granville NC.

The family on the Dan river and the Flatt river

Orange Co with other mixed blood Saponis Moses Riddle Thomas Gibson the Micajah Bunch the Collins and Gibsons.

The people were the pre Melungons.

They got tagged with the term Melungeon while at the Stoney Creek Baptist church.

I propose its time to stop calling Benjamin Bolling a Blue Bolling. He not he did not fall out the Blue he is solid documented with Saponi tribal family. Its time to give him and his family the honour and respect he devserves and call him as truly was a a member of the Sapini tribe a Pre Melungeom patriarch.

Benjamin Bolling is dead and cannot defend himself against Johny come lately family genealogist who chose to create him from something he was not.

So its job of those who came after him set the record straight.
