CHAMBERS, ANTHONY, was granted a cert. from Gunpowder Mtg. to Monacacy Mtg., 26 d, 6 mo., 1741 (136).

CHAMBERS, JAMES, m. by 13 Nov. 1775 Mary, dau. of John Tipton; sold land of John Tipton in Nov. 1775 and Oct. 1790 (231-AL#M:513; 231-WG#FF:124).

CHAMBERS, SARAH, ind. for bast., June 1734 (30:253).

CHAMBERS, THOMAS, m. 6 Aug. 1748 Mary Fox and had iss.: WILLIAM, b. 1747; ELINOR, b. 1749; poss. THOMAS, b. 1752; poss. JOS., b. 1755; JNO., b. 1 Oct. 1760 (131:64/r, 139/r).

CHAMBLEY, JOHN (1), b. c.1659, alive in 1731; in Nov. 1724 pet. to be levy free and stated he had been a res. of the county for 26 yrs; in March 1731 stated he was 72 yrs, and had had a sore leg for 10 years; prob. had: JOHN (27:37; 29:229).

CHAMBLEY, JOHN (2), prob. s. of John (1), m. Margery Cheek on or after 1 Oct. 1708 when the banns were pub.; alive in Aug. 1723; had iss.: MARY, b. c.1709, in June 1714 was bound to John and Sarah Rawlings; in Aug. 1723 at age 14 was bound to William Bradford and his wife to age 16 (21:508; 25:420; 128:24).

CHAMNESS, ANTHONY, m. 24 Nov. 1735 Sarah Cole, dau. of Joseph; Anthony may have been b. c.1713 in London; Sarah was b. 1 May 1718; they moved to Fred. Co., Md., then to Orange Co., N. C. (112:144; 133; Gen. and Hist., query 4061).

CHAMNEY, MARY, ind. and tried for bast in March 1733/4; see George Edgerton (30:183, 199).

CHAMPION, ISAAC, named as the father of Mary Fitzpatrick's bast. child in June 1731 (29:168).

CHANCE, JEREMIAH, was in Balto. Co. by 25 Nov. 1752 when he m. Wealthy Ann Milldews; had iss.: ANNE, b. 21 March 1754 (poss. m. Jonathan Hunter c.1770); MARY, b. 25 Nov. 1755; ELIZABETH, b. 6 March 1758; JOHN, b. 6 Nov. 1759; SARAH, b. 28 Nov. 1761; WILLIAM, b. 28 Feb. 1764; WEALTHY ANN, b. 14 Jan. 1766 (131:136/r, 141/r, 144/r, 152/r).

CHANCY. See CHAUNCEY.

CHANEY, BENJAMIN, m. June 1719 Ruth Chaney; had iss.: SARAH, b. 25 April 1720, m. James Murphy on 15 Dec. 1746; RUTH, b. 20 June 1722; BENJAMIN, b. 20 June 1722; ELIZABETH, b. 20 Dec. 1726; RICHARD, b. Nov. 1730; JACOB, b. May 1733; ELEANOR, b. 26 Feb. 1738; GREENBERRY, b. Aug. 1740; THOMAS, b. July 1743 (131:31, 85/r, 106/r, 107/r).

CHANEY. See also CHENEY.

CHAPMAN, ROBERT (1), was in Balto. Co. by 1705 as a taxable in Elk Ridge Hund.; d. by 9 Nov. 1749; m. Elizabeth (?); pat. 100 a.

of Betty's Adventure in 1710; he and w. Elizabeth sold this to John Hall in 1720; bought 100 a. Yate's Forbearance from John and Elizabeth Yate; sold same to William Hammond in Oct. 1741; exempt from levy in Nov. 1739; admin. bond posted 9 Nov. 1749 by Robert Chapman with William Macclan and Nathaniel Smith; est. inv. 7 Feb. 1749/50, filed by Robert Chapman and signed by Joseph Arnold and John Chapman as kin; had iss.: ROBERT, b. c.1707/8; SUSANNA, m. Joseph Arnold on 20 July 1736; JOHN; poss. ISAAC who m. Mary Fitzpatrick on 27 Oct. 1734 (11:366; 32:80; 63:473; 68:191; 76:31; 133; 205-41; 207; 291:55; 573; 574).

CHAPMAN, ROBERT (2), s. of Robert (1), b. c.1707/8, gave age as 68 on 9 Dec. 1776; may be the Robert who m. Elizabeth Taylor on 30 June 1736; was m. to Margaret (?) by Dec. 1749 when as "wheelwright, son and heir of Robert Chapman, dec." with w. Margaret sold Yate's Forbearance to Daniel Dulany; in 1750 owned 200 a. Buck Forest; in May 1759 with w. Margaret conv. Buck Forest to one Nathan Chapman; elected churchwarden of St. Thomas' Parish; had iss.: ROBERT, d. 1804; LUKE; NATHAN, d. 1807; DANIEL, d. 1753; JAMES, d. 1772; HELEN, b. 18 June 1763, d. 1823, m. Thomas Gorsuch in 1778 (80:385; 83:380; 133; 135; 153:200).

CHAPMAN, JOHN (3), s. of Robert (1), so placed because he signed the inv. of Robert Chapman in 1749/50 as kin; may be the John who was father of Martha Bastock's child in Nov. 1743; prob. the John who m. Mary, wid. of William Hall on 17 July 1746; prob. the John who signed the 1768 petition favoring removal of county seat from Joppa to Balto. Town (5; 35:72, 171; 133; 200-61).

CHAPMAN, LUKE (4), s. of Robert (2), prob. d. by 1790; m. 1754 Sorhia, wid. of Charles Conaway and dau. of John and Mary Wooden; in Sept. 1755 bought 132 a. Morgan's Tent Resurveyed from George Ogg; elected to vestry of St. Thomas' Par. in April 1764; living 1779 when he conv. Morgan's Tent Res. to Dorsey Barnes; wife Sophia was b. 29 Sept. 1727; had iss.: CHARLES, b. 20 Oct. 1755 or 1756; MARGARET, b. 5 March 1757; DANIEL, b. 10 Nov. 1758; STEPHEN, b. 19 Jan. 1760; MARY, b. 13 Aug. 1761; SARAH, b. 20 July 1763; LEAH, b. 24 May 1766; EPHRAIM, b. 27 Jan. 1767; SOPHIA, b. 29 Jan. 1769; SAMUEL, b. 9 Nov. 1770 (82:453; 133; 134:44, 45, 293; 135; 231-WG#C:118).

CHAPMAN, NATHAN (5), s. of Robert (2), b. c.1740, d. in 1807; m. Rebecca Griffith in 1760; Rebecca d. 1827; in 1759 bought 50 a. Buck Forest from Robert and Margaret Chapman; in 1763 bought 132 a. White Oak Bottom from Thomas and Martha Askew; with w. Rebecca conv. Francis Brothers 50 a. Buck Forest and 25 a. Nathan's Desire in Aug. 1764; bought 40 a. Parrish's Folly from Richard and Margaret Davis in Sept. 1769; left a will, 19 May 1807 - 8 July 1807; had iss.: JEMIMA, m. by lic. 2 Nov. 1780 William Hudson and by 1827 was in Mo.; ELIZABETH, m. by lic. 20 Feb. 1781 John Dettor, and by 1827 in Va.; WILLIAM, b. 1827 in Va.; REBECCA, m. by lic. of 5 Oct. 1791 Benjamin Gist Vaughan; JAMES, m. by lic. of 15 Feb. 1798 Rachel Merryman; NATHAN, Jr.; JOB, b. 1776; HELEN, b. 1774, d. 2 March 1831, m. John Reister, III, on 20 Dec. 1801; MARY, m. by 1827 Matthias Rider; HANNAH, d. 14 Sept. 1823; JOSHUA, d. 1795 (83:380; 87:470; 89:318; 117:198; 135; 231-AL#A).

CHAPMAN, BENJAMIN, b. c.1760 in Balto. Co., Md., d. in Roane Co., Tenn.; served in the Rev. War from Md.; m. Sarah McCorkle; by 1790 was in Washington Co., Tenn.; had iss.: SAMUEL; MARGARET, m. (?) Ford . (573).

CHAPMAN, ELIZABETH, bore a child and named John Arnold as the father, Nov. 1733 (30:142).

CHAPMAN, JOHN, surv. 150 a. Chapman's Fellowship in Jan. 1698 (211:27).

CHAPMAN, JOHN, married Hannah Markum when banns were pub. in June 1701 (128:11).

CHAPMAN, JOHN, m. Ann (?) and had iss.: JAMES, b. 10 Feb. 1719 (131).

CHAPMAN, NICHOLAS, b. 1758 in Balto. Co., Md., d. 25 July 1851 in Burke Co., N. C.; fought in the Rev. War from Burke Co.; m. and had iss.: GEORGE; JAMES; ROBERT; JOSHUA; JOHN; and MARY, m. (?) Hoil (574).

CHAPMAN, RICHARD, in Balto. Co. by 3 Jan. 1670/1, when he purch. land from Robert Morgan, cooper, and w. Bennett (97:123).

CHAPMAN, ROBERT, in Balto. Co. by 4 Aug. 1668 when he purch. land at Black Wolf Neck from Richard Farendall; but by Oct. 1672 was in Kent Co., Md., when he sold Wolf's Neck to Thomas Phelps of A. A. Co. (95:258; 99:347).

CHAPMAN, WILLIAM, was in Balto. Co. by 13 Jan. 1670/1 when he purch. part Taylor's Mount from John Owen; conv. the land back to Owens in Sept. 1671 (97:125; 98:45).

CHAPPELL, HENRY, in Balto. Co. by 1692 as a taxable in s. side Patapsco Hund. (138).

CHAPPELL, JOHN, merch., b. c.1732, gave his age as 53 in 1785 (310:121).

CHARNOCK, MARGARET, age 12 in Sept. 1737, was bound in the preceding June to William Robinson of Spesutia until she was 16 (31: 48).

CHARLETON, HENRY, in Balto. Co. by 1750 as the owner of 210 a. The Grove (153:21).

CHASE, SAMUEL (1), freeman of London, member of the Honorable Company of Tylers and Bricklayers, owned land in Maidenhead Court and Westminster, d. by 1725; m. Henrietta Catherine Davis who d. 1725; had iss.: THOMAS, b. c.1703; RICHARD, d. c.1742; an unnamed son (575).

CHASE, Rev. THOMAS (2), s. of Samuel (1) and Henrietta, was b. c. 1703; d. in Balto. Co. d. 1779; educ. at Cambridge Univ.; inducted in Stepney Par., Somerset Co., Md.; m. 1st Matilda, dau. of Thomas Walker of Som. Co.; she d. 1741, and he m. 2nd on 19 July 1763 in St. Paul's Par., Balto. Co., Ann Birch, eld. dau. of Thomas Birch, chirurgeon and man-midwife of Warwick, Eng.; was rector of Stepney Par., Som. Co., Md., from 1740, and rector of St. Paul's Par., from 1743 until his death; had iss.: by 1st w.: SAMUEL, b. 1741, Signer of the Declaration of Independence and Justice of the Supreme Court; by 2nd w.: THOMAS, b. 1765, d. 1773; ANN; ELIZABETH; GEORGE RUSSEL BIRCH; RICHARD (133).

CHASE, RICHARD (3), s. of Samuel (1) and Henrietta, d. 1742; educ. at Cambridge Univ., Eng.; chaplain to Lord Balto.; came to Md., where he was Rector of St. Margaret's Par., Westminster, A. A. Co., and other parishes; m. Margaret Frances, dau. of London merchant Jeremiah Townley; had iss.: RICHARD, d. 1757; JEREMIAH, delegate to the Assembly from St. M. Co., 1754-1755. m. Judith Dent, and d. s. p. 1755; (Judith d. 1790) (370).
