RICHARD MAREEN DUVALL, *b.* near Millersville, Anne Arundel County, Maryland, 1st November, 1856; *m.* 30th October, 1895, Julianna Webster GOLDSBOROUGH, by Rev. Osbourne Ingle, at All Saints' Protestant Episcopal Church, Frederick, Maryland, dau. of Dr. John Schley and Juliana W. (STRIDER) GOLDSBOROUGH of Frederick, Maryland. (See Goldsborough.)



No issue. RICHARD MAREEN DUVALL was educated at private schools, Anne Arundel Academy, and the State Normal School at Baltimore, Maryland.

From 1877 to 1883 taught public and private schools. He began the study of the law in January, 1880, with the late Judge William H. Tuck of Annapolis, and was admitted to the bar at Annapolis, in January, 1883.

Removed to Baltimore in September, 1883, and began the practice of the law in that city. Is a member of the Maryland Historical Society, the Maryland Original Research Society, the Bar Association of Baltimore City, and of the Maryland State Bar Association, trustee and member of the Executive Committee of Anne Arundel Academy, member of the Society of Colonial Wars, Sons of the Revolution and Saint Andrew's Society.

Lineage

MAREEN DUVALL, Merchant and Planter, a Huguenot refugee, came to Anne Arundel County, Maryland, about the year, 1655, and settled on the south side of the South River, upon a tract of land of several hundred acres, which was patented to him by Lord Baltimore by the name of "Laval." He was *b.* about 1630-5; *d.* August, 1694, at his home, "Middle Plantation," on South River, Anne Arundel Co., Md.; *m.* (firstly) ———; *m.* (secondly) Susanna, who *d.* about 1692; *m.* (thirdly) Mary STANTON, who *d.* between 1761 and 1782. She *m.* (secondly) Col. Henry RIDGELY, first, and *m.* (thirdly) Rev. Jacob HENDERSON, Rector of Queen Ann's Parish, Prince George's County, Maryland.

Mareen DUVALL contributed to the public cost of an expedition against the Nanticoke Indians in 1678. Appointed by the General Assembly of Maryland in 1683 a Commissioner to purchase sites and lay out towns, etc.

BARTON DUVALL, Planter, of Prince George's County, Maryland, *b.* 1776; *d.* 15th October, 1831; *m.* 26th November, 1811, Hannah ISAAC, *b.* 1788; *d.* 10th March, 1826; dau. of Joseph ISAAC, Esq., of Prince George's County, Maryland, and Anne WILLIAMS, his wife, dau. of Stockett WILLIAMS of Anne Arundel County, Maryland, and Mary WATERS, his wife. RICHARD ISAAC DUVALL, *b.* 4th September, 1814; *d.* 23d January, 1870; he was educated at Franklin School, Maryland; was a Justice of the Peace for Anne Arundel County, Maryland, for several years School Commissioner, and also Commissioner of the Levy Court for said county for two terms; Register of Wills for said county from 1861-2 to 1867; was an ardent sympathizer with the South during the late Civil War, and was several times arrested and imprisoned by the Union troops because of his work in behalf of the cause of the South.

He was one of the three originators and a founder and original stockholder and trustee of Anne Arundel Academy, near Millersville, Maryland.
