Samuel Duvall and Elizabeth Clarke/Clark or Elizabeth Ijams had eight daughters (Eleanor, Elizabeth, Susannah, Ruth, Ester, Sarah, Lucy, and Rachel).

2. [Elizabeth Duvall](#), born 1694. Married Edward Tyler. Alive when named in father's 1741 will.
3. [Susannah Duvall](#), born on September 3, 1698. Married Alexander Falconar. Alive when named in father's 1741 will.
4. [Ruth Duvall](#) born on July 31, 1703. Listed in Queen Anne's Parish Record Not listed in father's 1741 will so presumed deceased at that time.
5. [Ester Duvall](#) born on October 4, 1705. Listed in Queen Anne's Parish Record . Married William West. Alive when named in father's 1741 will.
6. [Sarah Duvall](#) born on August 28, 1708. Listed in Queen Anne's Parish Record . Married James Beck. Alive when named in father's 1741 will.
7. [Lucy Duvall](#). Birth date unknown. Not listed in Queen Anne's Parish Record. Married William Forrest. Alive when named in father's 1741 will.
8. [Rachel Duvall](#). Not listed in Queen Anne's Parish Record. Married Butts. Married Richard Butts. Alive when named in father's 1741 will.

## 1700 Neighbor in Batchelors Delight Transaction

PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY LAND RECORDS, Deed, January 3, 1700 From: ROBERT TYLER of Prince George's County, gent. To: RICHARD BUTT of Anne Arundel County, planter. Price: 69 pounds sterling Property: All the 206 and 1/4 acre tract called "Batchelors Delight" recently purchased by said TYLER from RICHARD MARSHAM, said tract being part of the 3,800 acres tract called "Darnalls Grove," formerly in Calvert County, now in Prince George's County, on the west side of Collington Branch; bounding on "Darnalls Grove," and land of SAMUEL DUVALL and ROBERT BRADLY. Signature: ROB'T TYLER Witnesses: RICHARD DUCKETT, LEWIS DUVALL Acknowledged: ROBERT TYLER and wife SUSANNA, January 3, 1700. Recorded: February 25, 1700, Volume A. Page 349. <sup>[2]</sup>

## 1702 Neighbor in Rogers Range Transaction

Prince George's County Land Records, Folio 108: Indenture, April 17, 1702, in the 14th year of the reign of Lord King William III From: Thomas Roper, bricklayer of Prince George's County To: Richard Clarke of Anne Arundel County, Gent. For £170 a 200 acres part of a larger tract called Roper's Range lying in Prince George's County between Western Branch and Collington Branch; bounded by land of Samuel Devall and Richard Butt Signed: Tho. Roper (mark) Witnessed: Jn'o Price and William Taylard Memorandum: April 17, 1702 Thomas Roper acknowledged deed before Charles Greenberry and Amos

Certification: At the time of the acknowledgement above Charles Greenberry and Amos Garrett were Justices of the Peace of Anne Arundel County; acknowledged by the Prince George's County Court on September 18, 1704. <sup>[2]</sup>

## 1726 Deposition in Enfields Change Petition

Prince George's Land Records 1726 - 1730 - Liber M, Page 212 Petition of Mary Carroll & Charles Carroll of Annapolis to the Justices on the 4th Tuesday in June last Charles, Lord Baron of Baltimore to John Magruder, Richard Keene, Archibald Edmonston, and John Hasewell; regarding boundaries of Enfield's Chance; depositions regarding boundaries: Deposition of Marreen Duvall, Sr., planter, age circa 65; mentions 2 tracts called Wilson's Plaines and Howerton's Range; mentions deponent's father, also George Yates, Henry Hanslop, John Duvall, Robert Proctor, etc. <sup>[2]</sup>

October 4, 1726 Deposition of Marreen Duvall, Sr., planter, age circa 65; mentions John Boyd and Robert Anderson. <sup>[2]</sup>

October 4, 1726 Deposition of Mareen Duvall [Jr.] of the Great Marsh, age circa 46; mentions his brothers John, Mareen, and Samuel; mentions Parrotts Thickets. <sup>[2]</sup>

October 4, 1726 Deposition of Robert Tyler, Gent., age circa 55; mentions Patuxent River, Robt. Anderson, Sr., mentions Enfield's Chance, land in possession of Madam Mary Carroll and land of George Yates, James White's Eglington, John Boyd, Sr., and David Fry; <sup>[2]</sup>

October 4, 1726 Deposition of Samuel Duvall, planter, age circa 58; mentions the Great Marsh, Parrotts Thickett, deponent's father's land called Howerton's Range; <sup>[2]</sup>

June 22, 1727 Deposition of Clement Hill, Gent., age circa 56; mentions Eglington now in possession of Henry Hall formerly laid out for James White of Anne Arundel County, Capt. John Hyde of London who resurveyed Enfield's Chance, Gabriel Parrott's land called Parrott's Thickets, Col. Ridgley's clear ground, Charles Carroll, etc.; <sup>[2]</sup>

June 23, 1727 Deposition of Robert Tyler, Gent., age circa 55; mentions Eglington, Enfield's Chance, John Hyde of London, Howerton's Range, etc.; <sup>[2]</sup>

June 27, 1727 Deposition of James Carroll, age circa 48; mentions Charles Carroll, deceased, Col. Henry Ridgley; Enfield's Chance of 100 acres, Richard Clark, land called Chatton, etc.; <sup>[2]</sup>

June 27, 1727 Deposition of Col. Ninian Beall, age circa 79; mentioned George Yates of Anne Arundel County, Charles Buttler told Ninian "thou art a brave boy for thou hast taken up 300 acres of land for my son Nedd meaning Edward Butler in Calvert County." [Beall recounted his memory of conversation regarding surveying on west side of the Patuxent]; mentioned Essington [?Eglington], James White, Padaway Farm, etc.; <sup>[2]</sup>

October 4, 1726 Deposition of Richard Keene, age circa 37; mentioned Major Josiah Wilson, lately deceased; <sup>[2]</sup>

July 1, 1727 Deposition of Lingan Wilson, age circa 23; mentioned Josiah Wilson Enrolled July 1, 1727. <sup>[2]</sup>

## 1733 Lease to Alexander Falconar

Prince George's Land Records 1730-1733 - Liber Q, Page 701 Enrolled at request of Clement Hill, Sr., , October 8, 1733 -- lease August 20, 1733 -- Indenture Between Alexander Falconar, merchant, of one part, and Richard Bennett of Queen Ann's County and Gilbert Falconar of Kent County, merchant; for £68; right in tract where Alexander [Falconar] dwells given by his father-in-law, Samuel Duvall, to his daughter Susanna [Duvall] Falconar, wife of said Alexander [Falconar], in case of Susanna [Duvall Falconar] dying without issue to her husband Alexander [Falconar] during his natural life; containing 100 acres; bounds in deed of gift from Samuel [Duvall] to Susanna [Duvall Falconar]. Liber I, folio 166, dated August 18, 1721; to [Richard] Bennett for the natural life of Alexander Falconar; /signed/ Alexr. Falconar; witness: Saml. Harare, Catherine Prather (mark). September 25, 1733 acknowledged by Alexander Falconar. <sup>[2]</sup>

## 1741 Death

1741 -- Samuel Duvall died at Prince George's County, Province of Maryland. <sup>[2]</sup>

January 11, 1741/1742 (1742) -- date Samuel Duvall's will probated Prince Georges County, Maryland. <sup>[2]</sup>

March 24, 1741/1742 (1742) -- date of Samuel Duvall's will, probated Prince Georges County, Maryland. <sup>[2]</sup>

Will: Duvall, Samuel, Sr., planter, Prince George's County, January 11, 1741; March 24, 1741.

1. To daughters Elizabeth Tyler, Susannah Falconar, and Esther West, 5 shillings each.
2. To daughter Sarah Beck, lot in Queen Ann's Town.
3. To daughter Lucy Forrest, 100 acres lying next to land of Henry Odell and

Richard Butt at her death to pass to her daughter Elizabeth; should she die without heirs to next heir of Lucy, aforesaid and in event of her death

1. To grandson Samuel Devall Beck son of James Beck, William Forrest, husband of Lucy, aforesaid to have life into in this.
2. To grandson Samuel Dewall Beck, 212 acres dwelling plan."
3. To daughter Rachel Butts, £10.
4. Executors: Grandsons Samuel and Edward Tyler and son-in-law James Beck. <sup>[2]</sup>

Samuel Duvall's Will. Test: David Watson, Joseph Peach, Robert Kunstuble (Konstable). 22. 442. Note: James [Beck] and Edward Tyler renounced executorship of will. <sup>[5]</sup>

## 1744 Inventory

Inventory: Samuel Duvall, Sr. 20.117 A Prince George's County £277.2.7 & £198.9.2

April 19, 1744 -- A second inventory cited in the amount of £39.6.9. Received from: Joseph Adams (merchant in London), Philip Smith (dead, merchant in London), Mr. Edward Gardiner, Mr. George Parker. Payments to: Joseph Peach, Henry Hall, Benjamin West per Mary Sollars, John Hepburn, Benjamin Jacobs. Mr. Peter Dent, Daniel Dulany, Esq., Richard Butt who married Rachel (daughter), William Forrest who married Lucy (daughter). Legatees (daughters):

1. Susannah wife of Alexander Falconer, # Ester/Esther wife of William West,
2. Elizabeth wife of Edward Tyler,
3. Lucy wife of William Forrest,
4. Rachel wife of Richard Butts.

Executor (acting): James Beck. <sup>[2]</sup>
