of Sumter and Marengo counties,
ALABAMA. - (Showing

- the lineage of Mary Elizabeth Hammond who was born Aug. 19, 1823, Marengo Co. Ala. and who married Joel Wooten Newton Feb. 6, 1838, Sumter Co. Ala.)
- I. Job Hammond was born in the year 1645 in Hampshire, England. (possibly on the Isle of Wight, Hampshire, where his Maryland cousins were born.) He came to Richmond County, Va. prior to 1677. Family records are in North Farnham Parish. Job's wife was named Elizabeth.
Job d. Jan. 2, 1726. Elizabeth d. June 17, 1717
Children: Job #2 b. Jul. 10, 1677; Elizabeth b. Mar. 10, 1680; William b. Sept. 3, 1682; Winnifred b. Jul. 22, 1698.
- II. Job Hammond #2 b. Jul. 10, 1677 and d. Oct. 19, 1756.
m. Amadine Baylis Sept. 1, 1703. She was b. Jan. 1684 North Farnham Parish, and d. ?. The daughter of Thomas and Catherine (Samford) Baylis.
Children: Thomas b. April 20, 1702; Susanna b. Jan. 7, 1705; Mersy b. Mar. 17, 1715; Samuel b. Mar. 19, 1722; Jarvis b. Sept. 27, 1725; Job #3 b. Jun. 25, 1729.
- III. Samuel Hammond #1 b. Mar. 19, 1722 North Farnham Parish, Richmond County, Va. and d. Oct., 1806 in S.C.
m. Mary Jenkins. She was b. May 2, 1720 in Northumberland Co., Va. and d. May, 1816 in S.C.
Samuel and Mary lived in Fairfax Co., Va. for a while, then migrated through Warren County N.C., arriving in Camden District South Carolina about 1783. (The area from which Lancaster County, S.C. was formed in 1798.)
- The old Hammond Family Cemetery is two miles south of Beaver Creek Baptist Church in the lower southwest part of Lancaster County, between Heath Springs and Stoneboro.
Children: Samuel #2 b. Nov. 9, 1753 in Va. (possibly in Fairfax Co.); Raleigh b. 1756 in Fairfax Co., Va., d. Aug., 1839 in Lancaster Co., S.C.; Charlotte b. ?
- IV. Samuel Hammond #2 b. Nov. 9, 1753 in Va. and d. Aug. 18, 1844 *See note later. He married Ann ("Nancy") Twitty. We have no more information on her except for the fact that the Twitty family of the Lancaster County S.C. area is said to be of Scotch descent.
*Note: In 1840 this Samuel Hammond was living in Sumter County, Ala. among his descendants. At that time he is listed as being 88 years old. He was drawing a pension for having served in the Revolutionary War from South Carolina and Virginia. His claim is #S-21807. In the Hammond Family Cemetery in Lancaster County, S.C. there is a monument for him which says: "Samuel Hammond, son of Samuel and Mary Hammond born 9th. Nov., 1753 - died 18th. Aug., 1844".
Children: Samuel S. Hammond b. 1784, S.C.; Matthew (Mathias) b. 1790, S.C.; Lemuel b. 1795, S.C. William Rawliegh Hammond b. 1802-03, S.C. + others.
