Biography

The eldest son of Robert Hubbard, Matthew, born 1627 in England, married Sibella Caynhoo in Virginia during February 1652. To this marriage three children were born John, Rebecca and Matthew. Matthew Hubbard was a merchant and early justice of York County, Virginia and married Sibella Ham, widow of Jerome Ham, justice of burgess. Of interest, in the home of Matthew Hubbard, there were four rooms besides kitchen, battery, outhouses, seven English servants, seven horses, 41 cattle, 15 pounds worth of plate. List of books he owned is given on p. 175 and included medical books, common prayer books, poems, Latin bible, astronomy tutorials, a French romance, Culpeper's Anatomy, Aesop's Fables, Culpeper's Dispensatory, Practice of Piety, etc.^[1]

The Hubbards prospered and Matthew Sr. served as Justice of the York County Court in Virginia, 25 January 1660. He followed in the footsteps of his grandfather Sir Henry, practising law, acquiring land and property with consummate skill.

On 18 August 1655 he patented 590 acres in New Kent County, Virginia.

The Will of Matthew Hubbard Sr. does not name his wife: 'Bequest to son John Hubbard, dividend of land at Skimino and also my dividend of land that is above Charles Edmonds. To daughter Rebecca and son Matthew Hubbard, my half of the dividend that is upon Black Creek to be divided between them.' Sibella Caynhoo was born c.1631 in England to Dorothy and William Caynhoo. The family went to Virginia before 1639 and William patented 300 acres of land in Charles River County on 26 September 1639. William patented a further 400 acres on the north side of the Charles River on October 1642.

William Caynhoo was an Anglican minister. By 5700 the Hubbards were deeply embedded in Virginia and it seemed nothing could shift them but even more interesting times were ahead for them as they began to disperse into the interior. ^[2]
