In the name of AMEN the 21<sup>st</sup> day of December anno Domini 1739-  
I Elizabeth King of the Parish of Northfarnham in the County of Richmond  
being very sick & weak but of perfect mind and memory & calling to mind  
the uncertain estate of this transitory life and that all this must  
yeeld unto Death when it shall please Gods call) Do make this my last  
will and Testament in manner and form following Revoking all other be-  
fore made or declared either by word or writing but this to be taken as my will  
and Testament and none other with standing any Statute to the contrary in any  
Clause Legatory in the same

First I Give my soul to God my maker & to Jesus Christ my Redeemer there to  
rest till my soul & body shall meet again and be found together again  
and be made parts of the Heaven leaving my body of mortality and my  
body to the earth from whence it came to be buried Decently by my Executors  
and as Touching my worldly estate as Goods Chattels and other things as the  
Lord hath been pleased here above my Defects to bestow upon me  
I Give and Bequeath and Dispose of the same in manner by form following

*Imp.* I Give and bequeath unto my son Edward Mores one Shilling <sup>cash</sup> to be paid  
him by my Executors here after mentioned

*Item* I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Mores Twenty Shillings  
to be paid her by my Executors here after mentioned
