

whereof it is the opinion of the Court- that the said Peter Routh deceased  
at the time of executing the writing aforesaid to wit, on the 6th day of  
December 1832, was of sound and disposing mind and memory and  
that he was under no undue influence and thereupon the said writing  
was proved according to law by the oaths of Mary A. McDonald and  
Eleanor McDonald witnesses thereto and by the evidence of Thos.  
G. Bradford who proved the hand writing of Alexander F. Ross an-  
other subscribing witness thereto who is now dead, it is therefore  
ordered that the said writing be recorded as for the last will  
& testament of the said Peter Routh decd. from which order the  
said Peter Routh junr. prayed an appeal which is allowed him  
on his giving bond and security in the penalty of \$60. and by  
consent of parties time is allowed him to give such bond until  
the end of the first day of the next Court
